DVSR Comment

Sections 2 and 3, duplicate results: Samples that were analyzed by both 8270 and 8270C SIM have duplicate results for the PAHs. Also, samples that were analyzed by 8260 and 8270 have duplicate results for 1,2,4-trichlorobenzene; 1,2-dichlorobenzene; 1,3-dichlorobenzene; 1,4-dichlorobenzene; hexachlorobutadiene; and naphthalene. Using the validator's professional judgment, reject one set of duplicate results, leaving only one valid value for each analyte, for each sample. Please add text to this section to describe the qualifications and the logic behind the professional judgment.

NERT Response: Results for PAHs that have been analyzed by methods 8270 and 8270C SIM and results for 1,2,4-trichlorobenzene; 1,2-dichlorobenzene; 1,3-dichlorobenzene; 1,4-dichlorobenzene; hexachlorobutadiene; and naphthalene analyzed by 8260 and 8270 were validated as part of this data set. Both sets of results were determined to be valid as a result of the data validation; therefore, both sets have been included in the DVSR. The decision on usability will be reserved for the data end user as part of the data evaluation.

NDEP/Neptune Response: Per a May 29, 2018 letter to Stauffer Management Company, Montrose Chemical Corporation and Olin Corporation, in response to an equivalent request, NDEP requested one value for each analyte be reported in the EDD. (This is consistent with current DVSR guidance.) The letter notes that justification for the choice is to be provided as needed; however, NDEP DVSR guidance (previous and current) requires the reasoning behind professional judgement be documented in the DVSR. Please revise the EDD and DVSR text to report one value for these duplicated analytes and to describe the reasoning behind the values chosen. Results can be rejected or qualified "DNR."

The DVSR and EDD have been revised so each sample has only one reported value per parameter. When a sample has a parameter analyzed by two or more methods, only one result is reported and the other results are flagged "DNR" (Do Not Report) with a reason code of "orr" (other result reported). In the revised EDD, non-selected results have "DNR" included in the final validation qualifier column.

In the DVSR, the following paragraph was added to Section 2.0 Volatile Organic Compounds to explain the DNR qualifications and reasoning for the values chosen.

When an individual sample had multiple valid results for a given analyte and filtered flag, a single result was selected based on the following priority: a result obtained by Method 8270C was chosen over a result from Method 8260B, as the larger sample volume required by SW8270 is typically more representative of the source material. Non-selected results were flagged "DNR" with the reason code "orr" (other result reported). Of the 19,947 results, 41 were qualified DNR due to multiple results reported for a given analyte.

In the DVSR, the following paragraph was added to Section 3.0 Semivolatile Organic Compounds to explain the DNR qualifications and reasoning for the values chosen.

When an individual sample had multiple valid results for a given analyte and filtered flag, a single result was selected based on the following priority: a result obtained by Method 8270C-SIM was chosen over a result from Method 8270C (non-SIM), due to the lower detection limits of Method 8270C-SIM. Non-selected results were flagged "DNR" with the reason code "orr" (other result reported). Of the 5,290 results, 1,306 were qualified DNR due to multiple results reported for a given analyte.

Additional text, consistent with these revisions above, was added to the DVSR Sections 2.0 and 3.0 for further clarity.
